Pauline Aarten (19-04-1985) obtained her BSc degree in Criminology at Leiden University in 2007 and her BSc degree in Education also at Leiden University in 2009. She received her MSc degree in Juvenile Delinquency at the Erasmus University in Rotterdam in 2009 and her MSc degree in Forensic Child and Youth Care Sciences at the University of Amsterdam in 2010.
