



It is commonly acknowledged that children who undergo violence are at increased risk for psychosocial and mental health problems. Furthermore, we know that most of the political violence takes place in low-income countries where resources for care are extremely limited. How to develop support systems that bridge the treatment gap?

This web-based resource package is an attempt to provide a care delivery framework to set up and provide community-based psychosocial care in conflict-affected settings. It contains information that describes the rationale, content and step-by-step implementation of the separate components of a multi-layered psychosocial care package.
