Curriculum Vitae

Mark Jordans (born 17 May 1975, Tegelen, the Netherlands) received a Masters Degree in Developmental Psychology from Leiden University (1999). After gaining experience in counseling and family support services in the Netherlands, he moved to Kathmandu (Nepal) in 2000 where he has worked and lived since. Initially his work concentrated on the development of long-term courses in counseling, for the Center for Victims of Torture Nepal (CVICT) and the (then) Transcultural Psychosocial Organization (TPO), as well as psychosocial care projects for diverse groups (youth trafficked for sexual exploitation, children affected by armed conflict, victims of torture). He was responsible for developing and teaching a one-year post graduate diploma course in psychological counseling (School of Applied Human Sciences; Purbhanchal University). Mark has co-lead the initiation and growth of TPO Nepal as a national service provider in community-based psychosocial care for vulnerable populations. Currently, he works as a researcher and technical advisor for HealthNet TPO Amsterdam (Department of Research & Development), where he coordinates several long-term research and intervention programs in conflict-affected settings (Nepal, Burundi, Sri Lanka, Indonesia, Sudan, Pakistan). His research concentrates on treatment process and impact evaluation, instrument development and factors related to the psychosocial wellbeing and mental health of children in low and middle-income countries. His main focus of work is on the interplay between research and intervention development in order to build research-informed, sustainable and effective care systems within complex emergencies and low-resource settings.
